### Prince Michael Award for innovative motorcycling guidelines

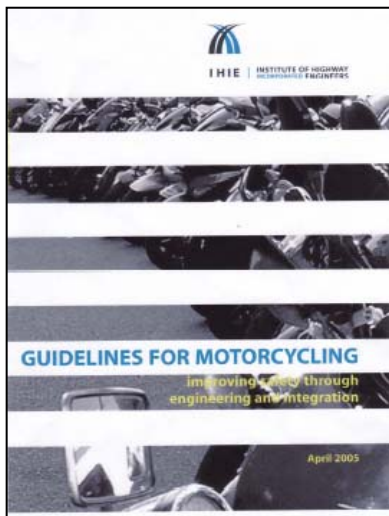
The Institute of Highway Incorporated Engineers (IHIE) has won a prestigious Prince Michael International Road Safety Award for its innovative ***Guidelines for Motorcycling ~ Improving safety through engineering and integration.***

The award was presented to IHIE by the MCIA's chairman, Geoff Sherley, on 27 October, the opening day of the 2005 International Motorcycle and Scooter Show at the NEC.

The Guidelines, which are a first in the UK, aim to assist highway and traffic engineers in developing a safer and more motorcycle friendly road environment.

Drawing on the combined expertise of engineers, road safety officers and motorcyclists, the Guidelines build on the Government's motorcycling strategy, and demonstrate the role motorcycling can play in an integrated transport system. David Jamieson, when Minister for Road Safety, launched the Government's strategy.

Accepting the award, IHIE President, Gerry Harvey, said:



"The transportation needs of motorcyclists have long presented a challenge for engineers and planners, so we're thrilled that our Guidelines have been recognised as a helpful tool and have been awarded the accolade of a Prince Michael Award."

"We hope that the Guidelines will help users develop their understanding of motorcycling issues and provide practical guidance about how they can best take motorcycles into account when designing transportation projects."

"The award is a fitting culmination of our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations".
